the field of pain management and completed a two-year residency training in Orofacial Pain and Dental Sleep Medicine, where she served as chief resident. After completing her residency, Dr. Omrani began practicing at the Pain Center at the Cedars-Sinai Medical Center.

Dr. Katayoun Omrani is board certified and is a Diplomate of the American Board of Orofacial Pain. As a lecturer and clinical professor at UCLA in the Department of Oral Medicine and Orofacial Pain, she is responsible for training residents. She is also a member of staff at Cedars-Sinai Medical Center. She is the former co-director of Orofacial Pain mini-residency at UCLA. Her research focus is in headache and neuropathic pain and has lectured extensively on these topics.

Dr. Omrani provides state-of-art diagnosis and treatment for chronic painful conditions in the head, face, neck and temporomandibular joint with an evidence-based approach and the use of current scientific knowledge and information supported by appropriate studies and research. She also assists patients with obstructive sleep apnea who can not tolerate a CPAP machine with dental devices.
