Familial Mediterranean fever (FMF) is an inherited disorder which involves repeated fevers and inflammation that often affects the lining of the abdomen, chest, or joints. It is most often caused by a mutation in the MEFV gene, which is a gene that synthesizes proteins involved in inflammation. FMF is a rare condition but commonly affects people of Mediterranean ancestry, especially Armenians, Arabs, and non-Ashkenazi (Sephardic) Jews. The clinical presentation of FMF varies and treatment is effective in most cases.
