Dr. Kaypekian is part of the new wave of young Armenian doctors, treating the population of Glendale and its surrounding region. Dr. Kaypekian established his medical practice, Glendale Pain Medicine Associates, to treat those in our community suffering from various acute and chronic pain conditions with state-of-the-art invasive and non-invasive forms of treatment. Today, at the request of our patients and physicians, Dr. Kaypekian also has two additional satellite offices in Pasadena and Encino.
