The congress gave them the opportunity to reconnect with past projects sponsored by AAMS and further strengthen their commitment to improving the medical infrastructure and education in the country.

A Visit to the Memory Cafe

First up was a trip to the Memory Café Yerevan, founded by longtime AAMS member Dr. Jane Mahakian, founder of the Alzheimer's Care Armenia. The café provides a safe and supportive environment for individuals affected by dementia, offering them the opportunity to socialize and enjoy a cup of tea with others on a similar journey. During their visit, the AAMS members witnessed the invaluable role these interactions play in improving the quality of life for those with dementia.



Meeting Scholarship Recipients

A highlight of the trip was a reception hosted by the Armenian Educational Foundation. There, the AAMS delegation met the first recipients of their scholarship program for Armenian students pursuing healthcare-related studies. The recipients are veterans of the Second Artsakh War studying medicine, dentistry, and pharmacy.



Visiting A.I. Alikhanyan National Science Laboratory

The delegation also visited the A.I. Alikhanyan National Science Laboratory, where they observed the newly installed oxygen generator in operation. AAMS collaborated with member organizations of the Armenian Medical International Committee (AMIC) to raise a combined \$750,000 to purchase this essential piece of equipment that will help fulfill the country's medical oxygen needs for at least the next fifty years.

Prior to departing Yerevan, they visited The Library at Homeland Defender's Rehabilitation Center Wounded Soldiers of Karabakh "2hu\nph unLu" in Yerevan, for which the AAMS raised \$100,000 for renovations. This space is crucial for training specialists in rehabilitative medicine and providing resources for the soldiers injured in Artsakh.
