EDUCATIONAL NEEDS

AAMS CME Planning Committee designed this symposium in response to member and community needs. These needs were identified from sources which include: member recognition of needs; observation of others; local hospital and national quality data (i.e., incident reports, medication utilization, patient satisfaction, legislative data, administrative data and core measures); review of literature including comments from newspapers, peer reviewed, evidence based scientific publications; national, state and local best practice guidelines; and research studies of accreditation bodies.

Heart, Health, and Primary Prevention: The Do's and Don'ts (CME) Describe lifestyle modification and healthy eating for best cardiac health. Outline lipid metabolism and describe lipid lowering medications.

Update on Men's Health (CME)

Discuss the various presentations of medical problems in urology. Integrate the understanding as it pertains to the topics of men's health. Treat the issues that are discussed in a more focused manner.

Ensuring Medication Adherence (CME & CDE)

Define medication adherence and its importance for patient health. Demonstrate knowledge on the importance of developing a routine process for inquiring about medication adherence.

Identify top reasons for patients' intentional nonadherence to medications.

Explain the importance of a personalized approach to medication adherence and patient involvement in treatment plans.

Depression and Anxiety in the Ambulatory Care Setting for Non-Mental Health Providers (CME & CDE) List risk factors for depression and anxiety.

Name and interpret screening tools in the ambulatory setting.

Recognize when to refer to higher level specialist or care.

Have increased competence in the pharmacological management of unipolar depression and various anxiety disorders.

Updates in Well Child Care (CME)

Recognize the importance of Well-Child Visits. Get familiar with various screening tools and referral sources. Communicate about vaccine hesitancy. Recognize and Respond to Barriers to Care.

Perspectives on Colorectal Cancer (CME)

Summarize the background on colorectal cancer (CRC). Examine who should undergo CRC screening and when. Differentiate the various options for CRC screening. Compare the pros and cons of "preferred" CRC screening tests. Demonstrate colonoscopy as a therapeutic modality.
