


Emily Alayan MS / 1st Year






Stella Gukasyan DPH / 2nd Year

Tulane University School of Public Health and Tropical Medicine



She has collaborated with federally qualified health centers in Los Angeles, including those serving the Armenian-American community, to enhance the quality of primary care. Stella holds a master's in human development and psychology from Harvard and a bachelor's in biology from UC San Diego. Stella has traveled across Armenia speaking on the emergent risk of HIV/AIDS given high migration and post-conflict situations. Her doctoral research will focus on how post-conflict biological stress and trauma embed within individuals and impact health outcomes for Armenians of Artsakh.

Alec Ohanian, a 4th-year medical student at UCSF with an MPH from Johns Hopkins, is dedicated to improving health in Armenia. His work there includes leading a multiinstitutional study with the KATIL Charitable Foundation, Johns Hopkins University, and Yerevan State Medical University on the needs of children with type 1 diabetes and advocating for improved governmentsupplied glucose monitoring systems; overseeing humanitarian aid distribution in Syunik as vice-president of All for Armenia; and building healthcare capacity through grants and technical expertise as a board member of the Armenian Healthcare Association of the Bay Area. Alec has committed to devoting his life's work to improving Armenian health and inspiring others to do the same.






Serly Thomasian MD / 1st Year

Serly Thomasian, a first-year medical student at Oakland University William Beaumont School of Medicine, was born and raised in Kuwait. She moved to the U.S. at age 17 by herself, where she faced significant challenges adapting to a new culture and educational system. Through the COPE Health Scholars Program, she worked with Armenian immigrant patients facing similar struggles, especially in healthcare. This gave her insight into the nuances of medical care and communication. Her community service also includes tutoring pre-med students, fundraising for displaced Armenian families in Syria, volunteering for war survivors in Armenia, and leading the Armenian Students' Association in college. Her experiences fueled her desire to focus on improving her community's healthcare quality and understanding and providing opportunities to Armenian communities in the Middle East.






Araz Majnoonian PhD UC San Diego

After finishing her PhD, Araz hopes to continue contributing to public health research and interventions in Armenia.
